On the east side of the Museum's Exhibit Hall, internationally known Polish greats include: Frederyk Chopin, Marie Skłodowska Curie (Madam Curie), Pope John Paul the Great, Cardinal John Krol, and Josef Pilsudski. **The showcases contain information about these Polish heroes and highlight Polish customs which continue to unite Polonia across the world.**



On the west side of the Museum's Exhibit Hall, internationally renowned Polish heroes such as Lech Walesa, Ignacy Jan Paderewski, Henryk Sienkiewicz and Mikolaj Kopernik (Nicholas Copernicus).



The west side of the Museum's Exhibit Hall also features paintings of great men and women of Polish descent such as Queen Jadwiga, General Casimir Pulaski, Adam Mickiewicz and General Thaddeus Kosciuszko.



The South wall of the Museum highlights the first two written democratic Constitutions in the world, America's Constitution of September 17, 1787, and Poland's Constitution of May 3, 1791. It also features Polish folk art and the coats-of-arms of towns and cities across Poland.

The **2016 World Youth Day held in Krakow, Poland from July 25th through the 31st**, was a great success as over one million young people journeyed to Poland from 187 nations around the world to partake in the occasion with special guest Pope Francis.

The **2016 World Youth Day** held in Krakow, Poland, took place as the world's Polonia marks the **1,050th Anniversary of Christianity in Poland and Poland's documented history (966 AD-2016)**. **World Youth Day** was initiated by Pope John Paul II and is held annually in local church communities, and as an **international event** every three years in a different country. This is the second time **World Youth Day** was held in Poland. The first time it was held in Czestochowa, Poland in 1991. The next International **World Youth Day** will take place in Panama in 2019.
