Wajda Shooting Film on Katyn Massacre

Filmmaking legend Andrzej Wajda brought Krakow to a standstill recently to film "Post Mortem," a screen retelling of the Katyn Massacre. Wajda has long considered this project.

The mass execution of 22,000 Polish soldiers and intellectuals in 1940, and the admission of responsibility on the part of the Russian government in 1990, has personal implications for the director: his father, Captain Jakub Wajda, was one of the officers murdered at Katyn. However, the film takes a different tack, telling the stories of the wives, mothers, and daughters of the slain officers.

The choice of Krakow for the filming is for both personal and historical reasons, since it is not only where Wajda and his mother awaited news about their lost family member, but is also the location from which Germany announced the discovery of the mass graves in 1943. The film is set for a September 17, 2007, release, the anniversary of the Soviet invasion of Poland in 1939.

**Kosciuszko Champion of
Human Rights
Outline of Kosciuszko's Will**

"I, Thaddeus Kosciuszko, being just in my departure from America, do hereby declare and direct that should I make no other testamentary disposition of my property in the United States thereby authorize my friend Thomas Jefferson to employ the whole thereof in purchasing negroes from among his own as any others and giving them liberty in my name, in giving them an education in trades and otherwise, and in having them instructed for their new condition in the duties of morality which may make them good neighbors, good fathers or mothers, husbands or wives and in their duties as citizens, teaching them to be defenders of their liberty and country and of the good order of society and in whatsoever may make them happy and useful, and I make the said Thomas Jefferson my executor of this."
